From the day-to-day services such as leaf/brush pick up, to building maintenance, to street paving and overseeing the entire water systems that supply the residences and businesses. DPW has a large responsibility to maintain the daily tasks of charting, vehicle upkeep for all village owned vehicles, street safety and maintenance and various other behind the scenes tasks that make our village a place to desire.

The DPW supports the Village's vision to bring the community together through parades, village signage, decorations and banners, set-up and preparation for village family events and adapting to meet COVID hurdles, such as outdoor dining set up.
