



Re: Timber Management/Harvest Proposal for Woods Hollow Nature Preserve

Dear Mr. Rossi,

Please find attached copies of the data that was produced from the cruise performed by Lumac Co. to assess the condition of the timber resource on the Woods Hollow property. It has been 24 years since a harvest was performed here, a harvest marked and supervised by Lumac Company, and the stand responded well to the previous harvest. Forest Management necessarily requires periodic harvests to reduce competition among individual trees within a stand, to capture trees that are no longer able to compete, to identify individual trees or species that may be infected by various insects or diseases, such as Gypsy Moth, in the case of primarily oak species, and Fomes Anosus, which is a disease spread among red pines through their root system, or to address individual trees whose condition may pose a danger to public safety. These thinnings typically occur every 15-20 years depending on the species and site conditions involved.

The cruise itself sampled approximately 2.6% of the acreage and generated volume numbers to provide an overview of the forest makeup on the property. As mentioned previously, the forest resource responded favorably to the previous harvest, and appears in good overall health. Stand densities have increased as expected, and a selective harvest is appropriate at this time. The top 5 species by volumes include white, red and Scotch pine, as well as black and red oak. No diseases were detected during the cruise, but the recent, and ongoing, Gypsy Moth infestation is taking a toll on the oak in areas of the property. This should be addressed by removing those individual trees that have responded poorly to the outbreak this year. Gypsy Moth cycles generally seem to run in 3 year increments, and individual trees responded differently in their ability to withstand defoliation. Aside from Gypsy Moth, a general thinning to reduce basal areas (densities), and to capture potential mortality is a good approach at this time.

Based on current markets, and the Village's desire to transfer ownership of the parcel to the Town of Milton, I am suggesting a harvest that can be put together this Fall, with the idea of using Mountain View Logging as the harvest contractor. They have the ability to do the work quickly, efficiently, and have the capacity to chip and remove much of the tree waste produced during the harvest from the site. This is a stumpage arrangement, and the harvested wood is accounted for each week as it is removed, and is paid for at the rates described in the Agreement between Lumac and the Village on a weekly basis. My cruise estimated a return to the Village of approximately \$60,000 to \$70,000 based on my estimates, however I believe these are conservative and the actual return may be quite higher. The benefit to this arrangement is that every board foot and cord is scaled and accounted for, and is not based on standing tree estimates which are often off substantially.

Finally, special consideration will be necessary to protect the harvest site from use during the operation. Use of social media and physical signage will be necessary to alert the public that the park is temporarily closed for use. We will work with the Village to create proper signage.

Please contact me with any questions or comments that arise during discussions with the Board, I will do my best to respond quickly. Thank you for your consideration of our proposal.





#### WITNESSETH:

In consideration of the terms contained herein the Parties do agree as follows:

- 1. The First Party agrees to sell all marked or designated timber located on its property, said property is located in the Town of Milton, County of Saratoga, State of New York.
- 2. The second party agrees to pay the first party at the following rates:

- b. #2 PRIME VENEER LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees, marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$2800.00 and \$4000.00 per thousand board feet.
- c. #3 PRIME VENEER LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees, marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$2000.00 and \$2799.00 per thousand board feet.
- d. #4 PRIME VENEER LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees, marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$1750.00 and \$1999.00 per thousand board feet.
- e. #5 PRIME VENEER LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees, marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$1450.00 and \$1749.00 per thousand board feet.
- f. #6 PRIME VENEER LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees, marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$1300.00 and \$1449.00 per thousand board feet.
- g. SELECT VENEER LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees, marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$1200.00 and \$1299.00 per thousand board feet.

- h. NUMBER ONE VENEER LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs deciduous (hardwood) trees, marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$900.00 and \$1199.00 per thousand board feet.
- i. PREMIUM HARDWOOD LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$650.00 and \$899.00 per thousand board feet or more.
- j. SELECT HARDWOOD LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$400.00 and \$649.00 per thousand board feet or more.
- k. NUMBER ONE HARDWOOD LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values between \$200.00 and \$399.00 per thousand board feet.
- 1. HARDWOOD LOGS shall be defined as all material cut in the form of logs from deciduous (hardwood) trees and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values less than those hereinabove described.
- m. PRIME PINE PLUS LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from coniferous (softwood) trees, and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values in excess of \$390.00 per thousand board feet (MBF).
- n. PRIME PINE LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from coniferous (softwood) trees, and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values in excess of \$350.00 per thousand board feet (MBF).
- o. NUMBER ONE PINE LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from coniferous (softwood) trees, and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values in excess of \$270.00 per thousand board feet (MBF).
- p. NUMBER TWO PINE LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from coniferous (softwood), and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values in excess of \$220.00.
- q. NUMBER THREE PINE LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from coniferous (softwood) or poplar trees, and marketed to Second Party's customer(s) with values less than those hereinabove described.

- r. NO. 1 POPLAR LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from poplar trees marketed to and graded by customer(s) of Second Party with values of \$400 per thousand board feet or more.
- s. NO. 2 POPLAR LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from poplar trees marketed to and graded by customer(s) of Second Party with values less than those hereinabove described.
- t. HEMLOCK LOGS shall be defined as that material cut in the form of logs from hemlock trees, marketed to and graded by customer(s) of Second Party as same.
- u. CW1 shall be defined as all that material not suitable for logs and for which second party receives net proceeds of \$25.00 or more per cord.
- v. CW2 shall be defined as all that material not suitable for logs and for which second party receives net proceeds between \$15.00 and \$24.99 or more per cord.
- w. CW3 shall be defined as all that material not suitable for logs and for which second party receives net proceeds between \$6.00 and \$14.99 or more per cord.
- x. CW4 shall be defined as all that material not suitable for logs and for which second party receives net proceeds less than \$6.00 per cord.
- y. MBF (THOUSAND BOARD FEET), CDS (CORDS), shall be defined by the customer(s) of the Second Party.
- 3. The First Party does herein warrant that they do own and/or have the sole authorization to convey said timber to the Second Party.
- 4. The First Party does herein convey to the Second Party the right of free and reasonable access and egress over their lands and rights of way, for the purpose of removing the hereinabove described timber
- 5. The First Party does herein agree to hold and protect said timber for the exclusive use by the Second Party during the life of this agreement.
- 6. The Parties do herein agree that this agreement is solely for the purchase of standing timber, and that the Second Party is in no manner acting as agent, and in no manner performing any duties or producing any product for the First Party.
- 7. The Second Party does herein warrant that they do hold insurance policies in effect for Workmen's Compensation, disability, General Business Liability, and Automotive Fleet. The Second Party hereby indemnifies and agrees to save harmless the First Party from any claim, suit or judgment by any person growing out of any act or operation of Second Party, his agents or employees or any

other person, done, or committed in connection with the felling, logging or removal of trees sold by this Contract or pursuant to any right or permission granted by the Contract. Second Party agrees that this Contract shall be void and of no effect unless the Second Party shall secure Worker's Compensation Insurance for the benefit of, and keep insured during the life of this Contract, such employees as are required to be so insured by the provisions of Chapter 41 of the Laws of 1914 of the Workmen's Compensation Law and acts amendatory thereof. Second Party shall furnish the First Party with certificates of same.

- 8. This agreement shall terminate December 31, 2024, or upon completion of all responsibilities under this Agreement.
- 9. The Second Party further agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws applicable to the performance of the provisions of this contract. All federal, state and local permits, which may be necessary to comply with said laws shall be obtained by the Second Party.
- 10. Payment for timber shall be due in accordance with the schedule under paragraph two of this agreement. Payments to First Party shall be dated no later than (10) days of receipt by Second Party of any mill slip from Second Party's customer.
- 11. The Second Party has agreed by the execution hereof, and hereby does agree, to pay for all timber cut by it upon the terms and conditions herein set forth.
- 12. The Second Party's forester shall designate those trees that will be cut by marking said trees with a paint spot at eye level, or by prescription as determined by Second Party's forester(s).
- 13. Selection of trees for harvest shall be in accordance with the objectives of the First Party, and consistent with proper silvicultural techniques and forest management practices.
- 14. Trees broken, bowed or badly scarred by the Second Party will be felled by the Second Party and paid for in accordance with the terms hereof.
- 15. All trees cut shall be severed at a height from the ground not to exceed one-half (1/2) the diameter at the point cut insofar as ground conditions permit, except that trees with damaged butts or bellbutts may be cut higher. Trees cut shall be utilized to a top diameter of five inches (5") insofar as the form and the condition of the tree will permit.
- 16. The Second Party does herein agree to backblade, level, and install erosion control devices where necessary on main skid trails, truck roads, and landings per "New York Forestry Best Management Practices for Water Quality."
- 17. Necessary logging truck roads shall be cleared and constructed by the Second Party, but only after their locations and specifications have been definitely agreed upon with the First Party. All labor necessary to construct said truck roads shall be furnished by the Second Party at no cost to the First

Party. Materials needed to construct said roadways shall be furnished by and/or paid for by Second Party. All existing roads within the area covered by this Contract, and other roads on First Party's property constructed or used by the Second Party shall at all times be kept free of logs, limbs, tops and other logging debris by the Second Party during its operation hereunder. Appropriate buffers, if any, required by the Village, shall be established and maintained during the life of this Agreement.

- 18. The Second Party shall take all necessary precautions to avoid undue damage to bridges, roads, trails, buildings, property lines, fences or other improvements on the First Party's property and to any public roads or other public property during the operation authorized by this Contract. The Second Party shall promptly repair all damage to such improvements and property resulting from the operation and shall continually maintain all bridges and roads, whether public or private, in such condition that they are safely and readily accessible by ordinary cars and trucks, or as may be directed by any public official with appropriate jurisdiction. Upon completion, temporary suspensions, or termination prior to completion of the logging operation contemplated by this agreement, all such improvements and property shall be restored by the Second Party to at least as good a condition as they were found. Damage to public improvements and property shall be repaired in accordance with the direction of any public official with appropriate jurisdiction.
- 19. Care shall be exercised in the felling, log cutting and skidding work so that undesignated standing trees and young growth will not be damaged unnecessarily. The logging operations and methods of the Second Party shall be performed in accordance with good forestry and logging practices. All harvesting activities carried out by the Second Party, its employees and subcontractors shall conform to the "Timber Harvesting Guidelines for New York" as published by New York State Society of American Foresters and Empire State Forest Products Association.
- 20. All tops and cull logs or pieces of logs shall be hauled back from fields, roadways, young plantations, and adjacent properties by the Second Party for a distance not less than ten feet (10').
- 21. The Second Party will not leave tops in streambeds.
- 22. The Second Party shall remove all man-made refuse that is part of or incidental to the logging operations. Such refuse includes, but is not limited to, oil cans, cables, and paper.
- 23. This contract may not be changed, modified or discharged orally.


