REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BALLSTON SPA, NY held October 23, 2023

Ethics Board Chair Julie Gazetos read a letter on behalf of the Ethics Board. (attached)

Ray Otten, 16 Middlebrook Avenue chastised Trustee Kormos for saying she wants it to be difficult for Village Officials to change the Ethics policy and for not taking Counsels advice.

Pete Martin of 20 Chesterwood Court and a member of the Ethics Board chastised the Board for manipulating the Ethics Code and ignoring Attorney advice.

Jared Iacolucci, 24 Chapman Street stated it was good to hear from the Ethics Board directly how they feel, but also thinks it's important that we can have civil disagreements about it.

Christine Fitzpatrick of 31 Chapman Street is in support of this Ethics law and thinks employees will have no issue with a disclosure form.

Marilyn Stephenson of 45 West High Street agreed with Ms. Fitzpatrick.

Gina Marozzi, 10 Old Glory Lane stated that the issue is not with having an updated Ethics Code, it is with some of the Board of Trustees having their fingerprints on the one thing that governs them.

Keith Lewis of 38 East High Street noted he is glad the code is being updated and feels the Trustees were right to rewrite the Ethics Code.

Mike Iacolucci, 9 Russell Street agreed with Mr. Lewis.

Motion made by Trustee Kormos, seconded by Trustee VanDeinse-Perez to close the Public Hearing at 7:29pm.

5) Mayor Announcements

The old Angelica site has been vandalized, seemingly by youth.

Noting that this is a felony, and these mistakes will follow you, Mayor Rossi urged educators and parents to reinforce respect for our community.

6) Liaison Reports

Trustee Kormos noted that Paul Mays has been approved to do the construction drawings for phase 1 of the Library renovations. Bidding should be ready May 24th. A total of \$230,000. Has been raised or committed towards the renovations.

Trustee Kormos said the ADA project data collection is complete. The public is invited to a meeting on 11/6.

Trustee VanDeinse-Perez reported that the Fire Dept. has had a total of 370 calls for assistance so far this year.

Trustee VanDeinse-Perez congratulated Nathan Tinney and Steven Bowers on their being hired as paid Firefighters in Saratoga Springs.

Additionally, Trustee VanDeinse-Perez stated that the BSBPA is looking for a Christmas Tree for Wiswall Park; if anyone knows of one, email dana@ballston.org.

Mayor Rossi thanked the Fire Dept. for their responsiveness.

Trustee Raymond said the DPW is very busy with multiple projects, including picking up loose leaves.

Trustee Baskin said the Park and Tree Board is working with Studio A on Wiswall Park renovations.

Regarding Victory Circle Park, Trustee Baskin reported that 2 benches will be placed there.

Mayor Rossi noted that a resident of Colonial Hills has concerns about the placement of the benches and urged better communication.

Paul Miller of 524 Victory Circle shared his concerns with the proposed placement of the benches, noting he has collected signatures of neighbors who also have concerns.

- 8) Presentation
 - a) Family Fun Day 2023 Review Financial & More (Mary Price-Bush)

Ms. Price-Bush stated that Family Fun Day came in \$4,000.00 under budget.

- 9) Old Business
 - a) Sidewalk Law (Trustee Baskin & Trustee Kormos)¹

Trustee Baskin gave an overview of what he and Trustee Kormos prefer as a plan for sidewalk replacement/repair.

In this plan, Trustee Baskin explained, everyone pays in as a community; if anyone wanted to fix their sidewalk ahead of the scheduled plan, they can get reimbursed up to 50% with a cap.

Trustee Kormos noted that sidewalk gaps will be filled in as well.

Mayor Rossi is concerned not only with administrative costs with this plan, but also with legal liability and increased insurance premiums.

Mayor Rossi stated that our insurer cautions against this type of plan.

The Board continued to discuss the topic.

b) Traffic Control Update (Trustee Kormos & Trustee Raymond)

Mayor Rossi noted that Ed Martin, who is with the BSCSD may purchase 2 solar mobile "Your Speed Is" signs that we would be able to use.

Trustee Kormos shared traffic violation data (attached) and stated that solutions will be explored.

Trustee Raymond spoke about stop sign violations.

10) New Business

Kris DuBuque of 6 Kaleen Drive spoke about the Mideast atrocities.

a) Resolution re: Israel & Mideast Peace (Trustee VanDeinse-Perez)

Trustee VanDeinse-Perez thanked Mr. DuBuque for sharing his thoughts, and the Board for helping with the resolution and read the resolution aloud.

Trustee Baskin feels that the violence perpetrated against Palestinians should also be condemned.

Trustee Kormos agreed with Trustee Baskin.

Trustee Baskin would like the resolution to be retitled as to say, "The Village Board condemns killing of innocent civilians in Israel and Palestine."

There was a unanimous show of support by the Board with respect to the resolution as amended.

b) Zoning/BOA RFPs (Mayor Rossi)

Mayor Rossi spoke about concerns with an email Trustee Kormos sent to potential bidders.

Attorney Buettner asked Trustee Kormos to forward the email list.

The Board extended the submission deadline.

c) John St. Water Tower Bid Documents/Bond Resolution (Mayor Rossi)

Trustee Kormos is glad that the bids include continued maintenance.

11) Public Comment (5-Minute Limit per Speaker)

Mr. Iacolucci, 24 Chapman Street thanked everyone who shared their perspectives on the Mideast Conflict.

Mr. DuBuque read an excerpt from an article about Mideast conflicts.

Ryan Johnson of 154 Milton Avenue stated he does not think neighborhoods without sidewalks, such as Colonial Hills should have to pay for other people's sidewalks.

Christin Iacolucci, 24 Chapman Street expressed her support for the new Ethics Law and the proposed Sidewalk Law.

Mr. Lewis spoke about the Woods Hollow contract.

Kamran Parwana, 86 South Street noted he would like to know what changes people objected to in the Ethic's Law.

Mr. Martin asked if not-for-profits can be exempt from the proposed sidewalk fee.

Mr. Otten remarked on the incredible number of man hours our volunteer Firefighters put in.

Ms. Marozzi asked why other organizations that the Village gives money to do not get audited, stating that Trustee Baskin is obsessed with Family Fun Day and asked him to stop using his office to harass people.

Mike Iacolucci, 9 Russell Street expressed his unhappiness with Ms. Marozzi's comments and questioned how the Family Fun Day numbers were arrived at.

Mary Price-Bush of 105 McLean Street explained Family Fun Day expenses.

And whereas, the Village has negotiated a purchase price of \$450,000.00 for the property and whereas the Board of Trustees has reviewed the SEQR documents relative to this matter finding that this is an unlisted action and whereas it is in the best interest of the Village to purchase the property for the use of municipal housing and Village Departments;

Now therefore be it resolved; that the Board of Trustees approves the purchase price of \$450,000.00.

And be it further resolved; that the Board of Trustees authorizes the Mayor to execute and deliver to the seller copies of the contract and purchase to transfer the property at 78 Thompson Street in the Town of Milton;

And be it further resolved; that the Board of Trustees further authorizes the Mayor to execute any and all other documents necessary to effectuate this purchase.
